

o. Children Recruitment





- To recruit 12-20 eligible children who are committed to join a one-year programme voluntarily
- To understand the scope of community development (e.g. playgrounds, roads and safety, vegetation)which child participants are interested for networking relevant stakeholders

- Partner may end the programme with events or workshops with children
















