About Child Caring Partnership Programme

Established in 1937, Plan International is one of the world's leading development organisations specifically focusing on children. We believe every child should have a chance to grow up with love and care.

To safeguard children's best interests requires concerted efforts of all members in our community. Plan International Hong Kong's "Child Caring Partnership Programme" aims to build a close partnership with corporates and organisations which are committed to child development in order to promote better child safeguarding practices and advance children's rights in Hong Kong, China and the developing countries.

The Child Caring Partnership Programme is a year-round partnership programme. Corporates, institutions or non-profit organisations are invited to join as Plan International Hong Kong's Child Caring Partners. By joining the programme, all Partners not only can fulfil their social responsibility but also enjoy ample profiling and staff engagement opportunities. Partners engaging in child safeguarding services would also be benefited from training workshops and consultancy services.

Child Safeguarding Movement:

To create an enabling environment for children's growth, Plan International Hong Kong is dedicated to promoting child safeguarding by conducting researches on situational analysis in Hong Kong and supporting child-related sectors in making organisational changes through the implementation of child safeguarding policy, personnel training, procedures reviews to ensure all possible preventive and control measures are taken in their daily operations.



Child Participatory Community Development:

To encourage children's voice to be heard in the community, a community-based approach is adapted to engage children in identifying the issues that are the most concerning to their protection and development and to facilitate child-led actions through effective and ethical child participation.



Youth Engagement and Development Education:

To inspire young people to advocate for girls' rights, Youth Conference and Be a Change-maker Campaign are organised annually to foster a sense of global citizenship among youths through project-based and experiential learnings.





Many children in developing countries are deprived of their basic rights, proper education and playtime. Due to poverty, many of them even suffer from malnutrition, are forced to become child laborers and child brides. Plan International delivers projects to support children in developing countries in six main areas including **education**, **early childhood development**, **ending violence**, **sexual and reproductive health**, **skills and decent work** and **young people driving change**, as well as **emergency relief projects**.

Meanwhile, as research shows that many girls in the developing countries are particularly vulnerable and face double discrimination because of their gender, Plan International also pledged to promote girls' voices and visibility, influence major policy outcomes based on their priorities and drive investments in their futures.

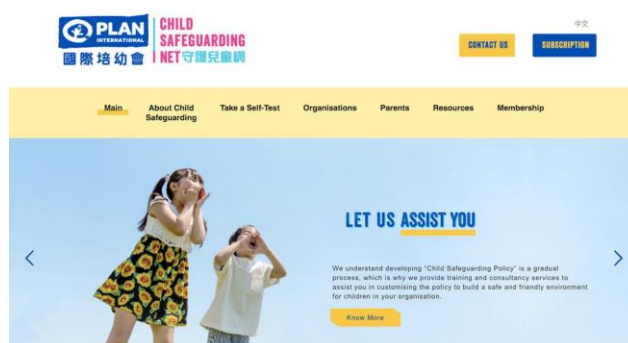
Recognising Social Responsible Efforts:
