# **CASE STORY: YOUNG MOTHER, BRIGHT FUTURE**



NAME: PATRICIA AGE: 21 YEARS OLD HOBBY: LEARNING

"When I started to participate in the Plan for Girls project activities, I started to feel confident that I could succeed. And that's what convinced me to go back to school."

#### **Meet Patricia**

Like your sponsored child, Patricia has been empowered by Plan International to change her life. Patricia is among the top students in her class—she's also one of the oldest. When she got pregnant four years ago, she had to drop out of school. But after joining a girls youth club, she regained her confidence and is now dreaming of a brighter future.

#### **Empowering Girls**

A lack of sexual and reproductive health education often leads to early pregnancies. Many girls, like Patricia, are shamed by their parents—without family support, they struggle to care for their new babies while continuing their education. In most cases, girls never return to school.

In Patricia's village, the Plan for Girls project is working to support girls and young women to take charge of their lives and bodies. By learning more about their rights, gender equality, and sexual health, girls gain the confidence they need to decide what their futures will be.

Through taking part in community events, Patricia realised she could still achieve her dreams, and returned to school.

#### **Supportive Families**

Patricia gained new skills and knowledge–and so did her parents. During activities for parents, Patricia's father became supportive of her returning home and continuing her education.

With this support, Patricia is able to focus on her studies and overcome the perception that a young mother cannot do well at school.

She is proud of her accomplishments and is excited to take on her next challenge—completing technical courses so she can get a good job and support her young child.

## **OUR PROJECTS IN BOHICON ARE HELPING CHILDREN THRIVE**

### REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH



Early pregnancy rates remain high in Bohicon–5% of girls under the age of 15 have already given birth. Early pregnancy can cause serious health complications for young women, and it often forces girls to drop out of school.

Through Champions of Change sessions, more than 700 young people learned about their sexual and reproductive health. Girls and boys also learned about their rights and gender equality, helping them to take charge of their bodies and form positive relationships as they get older.

76 teachers also completed training on how to teach adolescent sexual and reproductive health to students at schools. Additionally, 120 community volunteers are now acting as mentors to youth in their villages, helping to inspire them to continue their education and dream big for their futures.

# **EDUCATION FOR GIRLS**



Less than half of girls are enrolled in secondary school. Girls' education is not highly valued, and early pregnancies often mean girls do not complete their studies.

To help improve the conditions of schools in Bohicon, six new classrooms and 40 new toilets were constructed. 2,000 new benches and tables were provided as well, ensuring children have comfortable places to sit and learn.

672 new mentors are also coaching 16,800 girls in their communities on the importance of staying in school and how to make informed decisions about their bodies and futures.

And 300 young women have now completed apprenticeship training. They also learned how to draft a business plan, helping them earn an income as they become adults.



"A project run by women in my village is raising awareness on reproductive health so that young people avoid early pregnancies. I also learned that I should finish my studies and start working before getting married. I will share what I have learned with my peers."
