Meet Vivian

Like your sponsored child, Vivian has been empowered by Plan International to change her life.

Vivian lives in Teresina, a city in northeast Brazil. Vivian's mother, Rosinete, often worried about her children's safety – a common concern in Teresina.

Steps Toward Safer Lives

Vivian and Rosinete first discovered Plan through Infância Feliz ("Happy Childhood"), a participating project at Vivian's school. From there, Plan went on to develop the Espaço Brincar ("Play Space") at Vivian's school.

Rosinete is very happy with how Plan has supported her community, from checking in with local families during the pandemic to collaborating with educators at the local school.

International Day of the Girl

This year, Vivian participated in Plan's #Girlstakeover program on International Day of the Girl on 11 October.

With Plan's support, Vivian represented her community to Teresina's Secretariat of Education. In her role, Vivian delivered a letter about the state of public education in Teresina, which also advocated to provide greater digital literacy to local students.

Vivian's work on the #Girlstakeover day made her feel happy and celebrated. She learned that there are people in her community who care deeply about her education.

OUR PROJECTS IN CODÓ ARE HELPING CHILDREN THRIVE

CHILDREN'S RIGHTS AND PROTECTION




Workshops offered community members of all ages valuable lessons about safety. Every hour, one in five children or teenagers in Brazil is a victim of sexual violence. 87% of those victims are girls.

Over the last year, 513 students aged 7 to 11 took part in workshops focusing on topics like Identifying risks and acting on them, and Rights of children and adolescents. Educators emphasised positive masculinity, gender equality, and building safe spaces for all students.

Meanwhile, parents and educators received training in subjects like Education Without Violence and Domestic Accident Prevention. Classes took place online and, eventually, in person, aided by safety measures like liquid soap, masks, and alcohol gel.

BREAKING BARRIERS



We're combatting these statistics through sports. A total of 1,321 girls and boys have participated in La League, our extracurricular soccer league with a focus on fighting sexism, building confidence, and addressing inequality.

Over the years, Codó has become home to ten different youth soccer leagues. Plan has created action steps to assist in two cases of child marriage, and hundreds of local parents have been reached with educational materials.

"In a generation where many people say that a woman's place is not on the courts, I say that we have to fight, follow our dream, seek, and be. We cannot let fear and criticism take away our hope; with focus and determination we can reach any goal."
