



YOUR ANNUAL UPDATE

Thanks to your sponsorship, children and families are making positive changes in Poni. Learn more about the valuable ways your support has benefitted them.

This year, Plan International's projects in Poni focused on sanitation, nutrition, education and the prevention of human trafficking. 2,047 infants will now be breastfed and given enriched porridge. 322 children will receive food from 7 local resource centres.

259 children with disabilities received medical care, and 5 visually impaired children received funding to pay their school fees. 823 girls learned about menstrual hygiene, while 14 organisations were established to prevent the trafficking of young children.

Meet Zonabo

Like your sponsored child, Zonabo has been empowered by Plan International to change her life. Since 2016, Burkina Faso has been overwhelmed by a violent political crisis. The unpredictable danger has forced more than 1.7 million families, including Zonabo's, to flee their homes.

Safer Together

16 year old Zonabo escaped political turmoil with her family four years ago. At that time, she had already dropped out of school. Having left behind the land they knew how to cultivate, Zonabo's family - like many displaced families struggled to make ends meet. Through Plan, Zonabo participated in a training on entrepreneurship, a vocational course that has now reached 1,500 displaced people in Burkina Faso. Plan provided Zonabo with unconditional cash support, which she used to start her business. In total, 1,734 sponsored children including Zonabo - have received financial and emotional support from Plan's programmes for displaced people. Through Plan's workshops, longtime locals and their new displaced neighbours are learning to build peaceful communities.

You Can Count On Me

Initially, Zonabo used her seed funding from Plan to sell mangoes. Then, she went on to selling condiments, which she still does today. Zonabo also helps her mother – another graduate of Plan's vocational training course – to prepare cakes and oil.

Zonabo has become a role model to other girls in her new community. She is proud and confident to be able to contribute in her family. With this new financial freedom, Zonabo helps her loved ones build a safer, stronger life in a village free from violence.

OUR PROJECTS IN PONI ARE HELPING CHILDREN THRIVE



83.5% of infants in Poni are now exclusively breastfed, compared to 69.6% nationally.

IMPROVING HEALTH AND SANITATION



8,312 community members learned about safer hygiene practises. In Poni, just 20.6% of residents have access to sanitation services. Women and girls rarely have access to private latrines, which can leave them vulnerable to violence.

This year, 16 village sanitation committees were established to talk openly about health and hygiene. 73 educators and community supervisors were trained to combat taboos around menstruation and educate people about the dangers of open defecation. In total, these leaders passed on skills to 8,312 individuals.

1,856 students at 31 schools received lessons specifically on menstrual health. In order to combat a scarcity of resources, 831 girls learned how to make reusable sanitary napkins.





FEEDING THE FUTURE

2,047 pregnant and breastfeeding women reported improved food situations for their children. In Burkina Faso, a lack of information about early childhood nutrition perpetuates chronic malnourishment.

This year, Plan worked with breastfeeding and expecting mothers to improve the nutrition of their children. 2,047 women learned about the importance of breastfeeding in a child's first 23 months, the food groups and supplementary food.

75 villages in Poni received cooking demonstration materials, and 5 Nutritional and Recovery Centres received food donations. 148 community health workers learned about Infant and Young Child Feeding, and 60 health workers were trained to treat Chronic Malnutrition.
