The province of Sanmatenga is located in Burkina Faso's Centre-Nord region, one of the country's hardest-hit regions during years of political unrest. The crisis has resulted in the displacement of 1.7 million people, the majority of whom remain in Centre-Nord.

This year, 1,252 host families were reached with information about the importance of education for displaced children. 3,029 displaced girls received school supplies, and 506 out-of-school children were enrolled in remedial support centres.

#### **Meet Zonabo**

Like your sponsored child, Zonabo has been empowered by Plan International to change her life. Since 2016, Burkina Faso has been overwhelmed by a violent political crisis. The unpredictable danger has forced more than 1.7 million families, including Zonabo's, to flee their homes.

#### Safer Together

16-year-old Zonabo and her family escaped political turmoil four years ago. At that time, she had already dropped out of school. Having left behind the land they knew how to cultivate, Zonabo's family – like many displaced families – struggled to make ends meet. Through Plan International, Zonabo participated in a training on entrepreneurship, a vocational course that has now reached 1,500 displaced people in Burkina Faso.

Plan provided Zonabo with cash support, which she used to start her business. In total, 1,734 sponsored children – including Zonabo – have received financial and emotional support from Plan's programmes for displaced people. Through Plan's workshops, long-time locals and their new displaced neighbours are learning to build peaceful communities.

#### You Can Count On Me

Initially, Zonabo used her seed funding from Plan to sell mangoes. Then, she went on to selling condiments, which she still does today. Zonabo also helps her mother – another graduate of Plan's vocational training course – to prepare cakes and oil.

Zonabo has become a role model to other girls in her new community. She is proud and confident to be able to contribute to her family. With this new financial freedom, Zonabo helps her loved ones build a safer, stronger life in a village free from violence.

### **OUR PROJECTS IN SANMATENGA ARE HELPING CHILDREN THRIVE**



In an area hard-hit by political violence, hundreds of students received vital support to continue their studies.

# **EDUCATION FOR EVERY CHILD**



A years-long political crisis in Burkina Faso has forced 41,089 students in Sanmatenga out of school. As violence persists in Burkina Faso's Centre-Nord region, 419 schools have had to close, including 273 in Sanmatenga. 19,025 of the affected students are young girls.

Since 2020, Plan International's "BASE" programme has worked to offer remedial education, scholarships, emotional support, and resources to students and teachers in at-risk communities. This year, 1,498 sponsored children received funds to pay their school fees, while an additional 682 students received scholarships.

39 classrooms were built, which will support the learning of 2,670 students. 6,148 students received school supplies, along with 1,744 girls receiving menstrual hygiene kits. 62 teachers have been trained on safer schooling and gender equality.



# **STAYING HEALTHY AND HAPPY**



#### Just 14% of Sanmatenga's population has access to

**latrines.** When girls in Sanmatenga are menstruating, that means that they are unlikely to have private, hygienic places to meet their needs. As a result, girls tend to stay home from school during menstruation. While their absences pile up, girls become more likely to fail their courses and drop out of school.

This year, Plan International worked to keep Sanmatenga's girls in school by training 39 educators from 4 schools, as well as 4 community leaders, about menstrual hygiene. By breaking down taboos from the top down, girls around Sanmatenga will learn to create reusable sanitary napkins.



224 girls and 192 boys have been reached by menstrual health education workshops.
