Education is a key focus in Shaanxi, with parents, teachers and children of all ages participating in a variety of programs to strengthen children's educational and vocational opportunities.

Parents, teachers and students participated in education and awareness training on the impacts of bullying within schools and learned strategies to prevent and address bullying at all stages.

Students and teachers also participated in programmes to encourage girls to engage in the fields of Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM). These programmes have opened up wider career opportunities for children in Shaanxi, especially girls.

Meet Xiaoxin

Like the child you sponsor, Xiaoxin has been empowered by Plan International to change her life. Xiaoxin, a secondary school student, lives in a minority village in a border county of Yunnan Province. In her village, it is common for young adults to leave their hometown in search of work, rather than completing further study.

Adolescent children generally lack selfconfidence, easily lose interest in academics, and are short of soft skills in life. Gender stereotypes can present additional barriers to young girls, limiting their opportunities and ambitions.

Learning important life skills

Plan is working with local education departments to provide training and support for secondary school students, including guidance on important life skills and career planning.

Students participate in activities including career planning and financial management, which equip them with practical life skills, build their self-confidence and fully prepare them for the transition from school to future learning and social life.

Gaining confidence and ambition

Through her participation in these activities, Xiaoxin has gained confidence, participating in activities and taking a leadership role amongst her peers. Career counselling has also helped her determine her future life goals. After graduating from lower secondary school, she will continue her study in higher secondary school and work hard to get into a good university. She hopes to become an excellent teacher in the future.

Xiaoxin's parents, motivated by her positive performance, are very supportive of her and hope that she can live the life she wants in the future.

GIRLS IN STEM




Girls often have limited access to STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Maths) opportunities, especially in rural areas. Due to harmful gender stereotypes and lack of resources, rural girls face more obstacles in improving their ability in science and technology, which also limits their future career opportunities and contributes to the low rates of women in STEM-related jobs.

Plan is supporting schools to carry out teacher training, girls' STEM club courses, technology day activities and reading promotion in order to encourage their educational development in STEM-related areas.

40 teachers have participated in training on STEM theory, as well as gender equality and inclusivity, to understand the importance of breaking gender stereotypes and improving the ability of all children, including girls, to learn hands on practical skills.


1,150 students, including 672 girls, participated in the school's STEM club courses. Children, especially girls, have enhanced their interest, ability and confidence in learning technology.

PREVENTING BULLYING IN SCHOOLS



Through Plan's Anti-School Bullying campaign, 6 schools improved their school bullying prevention systems. They carried out a series of activities to raise awareness on bullying for teachers and parents and encourage students to create a bullying-free environment.

2,540 students, including 1,256 girls, helped to spread awareness on strategies to prevent bullying, through class meetings, handwritten newspapers, knowledge lectures, hidden danger investigations, and performances.
