This past year, young people learned about sexual and reproductive health and rights. They addressed discriminatory gender stereotypes, while gaining information and skills needed to make life decisions.

In addition, 60 health professionals strengthened their ability to work with adolescents, reducing pregnancy in girls and adolescents. Mothers and fathers practiced positive parenting, challenged harmful norms regarding fatherhood and masculinity, and nurtured healthy, gender-equal families.

#### **Meet Dayana**

Like your sponsored child, Dayana has been empowered by Plan International to change her life. Before her participation in the leadership school, Dayana was shy and reserved. She was afraid to express herself in public, and she wasn't confident talking with her family about issues she was curious about.

### **Facing Gender Challenges**

Now Dayana is attending her last year of secondary education, after which she will go to university and study for the future she always wanted—to be a doctor. Dayana is the fourth of five siblings growing up in the Ecuadorian highlands, surrounded by high mountains and a river where her family caught fish.

The COVID-19 pandemic severely impacted her family, who found themselves lacking money and food. In her family, there are more men than women, which meant Dayana was responsible for domestic responsibilities, such as caring for her younger brother as well as the animals.

Unlike her brothers, Dayana wasn't able to participate in social, cultural and sporting events, and had little time to play.

#### **Encouraged to Participate**

With Plan's support, Dayana learned about her rights—and discovered her dream of becoming a doctor. Along with 43 friends, she took workshops on gender equality, selfesteem, communication, sexuality and leadership. Today, Dayana is confident and secure. She has her family's support and her priorities for her future are clear. Even better, she's encouraging other girls to pursue their dreams. Recently, Dayana participated in a TV interview to promote girls' rights and commemorate International Women's Day. With her newfound leadership abilities and confidence, Dayana—and girls like her—are changing the world and their places in it.

## **OUR PROJECTS IN CHIMBORAZO BOLIVAR ARE HELPING CHILDREN THRIVE**



Savings and credit groups help women gain financial skills for income-generating activities. In these 29 communities, participants learned to establish and promote productive, craft and commercial enterprises.





It is difficult for young people, especially women, to find quality employment in Chimborazo Bolívar. Few feel confident in their financial or digital skills, and young workers lack access to employment opportunities. Many migrate outside their communities in search of work.

To empower people with skills and resources, 29 youth organisations participated in training events to develop business plans. Youth acquired skills, and learned to develop profitable enterprises with an ecological approach. In addition, 1,217 youth are part of entrepreneurs' clubs, and attended workshops to strengthen their financial, digital and leadership skills. Entrepreneurs challenged negative stereotypes and embraced gender-equal access to employment.

In addition, more than 900 people participated in community savings and credit groups, where the shareholders adopt a culture of savings and can access credit to implement and grow their business initiatives.

## **SEXUAL & REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH**



Early pregnancy is an issue in Chimborazo Bolívar, which has an 18% rate of teenage pregnancy.

Young people have limited access to sexual and reproductive health information and services, and often don't know where to go to seek help. In addition, many youth feel sexual pressure and have internalized harmful ideas about gender relations. Knowledge and resources are key to helping youth learn about their rights and reduce early pregnancy and gender-based violence.

To address this, 600 adolescents and young people participated in educational workshops to learn about their sexual and reproductive rights and gender equality. They also improved their self-esteem and developed life projects.





"It is good to learn about our sexual rights and to protect ourselves against various diseases and early pregnancy, we may not be able to continue with our studies and not fulfil our life project. Thanks to Plan which is always supporting us."


