One of the main areas of focus in Giza has been raising the status of young women and girls. We want girls and boys to reach their full potential in an all enabling and gender responsive environment. 319 youth between the ages of 15 and 18 were trained in career planning, and 244 were trained in financial education through Aflateen sessions.

The Champions of Change curriculum was used to facilitate several workshops for the Strengthening Women Entrepreneurs Project (SWEET). 1000 girls received the tools they needed from these workshops to decide on their own futures.

Meet Basma

Like your sponsored child, Basma has been empowered by Plan International to change her life. Basma was married at 17 in Behera and unfortunately was negatively impacted by her current socio-economic status. Basma understands the importance of an education and wants her children receives one.

Challenge

Basma has found it difficult to balance supporting her husband and playing an active role in the lives of her children. Basma's children are at various stages academically and have different needs. She constantly feels the pressure of providing for their education.

Finding work has been difficult for Basma and starting a business is not an easy task. Living in a rural town, the opportunities are quite limited.

The search for work has also been difficult because Basma never received any training or experience that she felt was necessary to qualify her to work.

Solution

Plan International works with local organisations to provide support and activities to both children and their families.

Basma attended the "Enterprise your Life" sessions which provided her with a role model in business that she could learn from. Basma has been able to start her own business of duck breeding. She has learned how to negotiate costs, communicate with suppliers and has been able to make enough to pay for living expenses. Through vocational training she has been empowered to even produce and sell her own object made from animals' horns from home.

OUR PROJECTS IN GIZA ARE HELPING CHILDREN THRIVE



The program works to strengthen girls' and young women's agency over the decisions that affect them, as well as by building their knowledge, confidence, skills and access to and control over resources.

EMPOWERING WOMEN AND GIRLS



It is important for women to realize their right to economic participation from an early age. In Giza, the unemployment rate for women over the age of 15 was 24 percent in 2021, compared to 5 percent for men. Women are not given equal opportunities in the work force and this also translates into their ability to participate in household decision making.

The Strengthening Women Entrepreneurs in Egypt (SWEET) project assists women and adolescent girls in the carpet industry. The project takes a three-pronged rights-based and gender-transformative approach.

The aim of the project is to improve social status and provide women with business and market specific technical skills to enhance opportunities in their industries. Girls are trained on how to make informed, individuals and assertive decisions while enhancing their knowledge of economic rights and gender equality in the carpet sector.

ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT







To have economic growth, inequality must be addressed Having sufficient income can lead to a productive life, selfreliance and it can empower individuals to make informed decisions about their futures.

Adolescents aged 15-18 attended Aflateen sessions. Through social education, participants learn to think critically about their rights and responsibilities, gain financial knowledge and gain a better grasp on life transitions. Youth also attend career planning where they are given the space to think about their goals and what they are able to do to achieve them. In the Enterprise your Life sessions participants met business role models who imparted business knowledge to aspiring entrepreneurs. These sessions help foster a healthy and hopeful environment for motivated youth who want to see a solution to their circumstances
