Meet Basma

Like your sponsored child, Basma has been empowered by Plan International to change her life. Basma was married at 17 in Behera and unfortunately children has negatively impacted her current socio-economic status. Basma understands the importance of a education and wants to ensure her children get one.

Challenge

Basma has found it difficult to balance supporting her husband and playing an active role in the lives of her children. Basma's children are at various stages academically and have different needs. She constantly feels the pressure of providing for their education.

Finding work has been difficult for Basma and starting a business is not an easy task. Living in a rural town, the opportunities are quite limited.

The search for work has also been difficult because Basma never received any training or experience that she felt was necessary to qualify her to work.

Solution

Plan International works with local organisations to provide support and activities to both children and their families.

Basma attended the "Enterprise your Life" sessions which provided her with a role model in business that she could learn from. Basma has been able to start her own business of duck breeding. She has learned how to negotiate costs, communicate with suppliers and has been able to make enough to pay for living expenses. Through vocational training she has been empowered to even produce and sell her own object made from animals' horns from home.

OUR PROJECTS IN ASSIUT ARE HELPING CHILDREN THRIVE



ELIMINATING FGM



Society must reject the idea of female genital mutilation (FGM) as a cultural necessity in order to eliminate the practice of it. Civil society organisations and national stakeholders have the capacity to support the abandonment of FGM and harmful practices. The projects that are in place are meant to reinforce this capacity. Intergenerational dialogue sessions create a space where youth and elders can gather and openly discuss their concerns regarding early marriage and FGM.

974 parents attend awareness sessions highlighting gender equality and the discrimination girls experience in their society.

A variety of initiatives, including a puppet theatre, sporting events, positive graffiti and medical convoys, have contributed to spreading awareness of the dangers of FGM. Through these programmes not only are the practices abandoned but we are able to transform social norms and empower girls. We promoted the programme in coordination with universities and students from medical, religious and legal backgrounds.



SEXUAL AND REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH



Girls from an early age face disadvantages in education, health, employment, and domestic life. This is why it is important for youth, girls in particular, to take action regarding gender equality, sexual and reproductive health, protection and decision making at all levels.

Girls receive training on Champions of Change and comprehensive sexual education curriculums. Through this activity girls will exchange stories and experiences while enhancing their ability to facilitate discussions and improving their interpersonal skills.



Activities also include community and family-based training. Through awareness sessions, we challenge stereotypes and socially accepted forms of violence and discrimination.
