This past year, hundreds of young people gained the skills and knowledge they need to confidently enter adulthood. Through training sessions on sexual and reproductive health, youth can now take charge of their bodies. And farming and entrepreneurship skills mean they can earn a good living for years to come.

Children are also able to grow up safe and protected. 1,769 children now have birth certificates, helping them claim their rights. And 226 children can access safe water, freeing them from the risk of deadly diseases.

Meet Mira

Like your sponsored child, Mira has been empowered by Plan International to change her life. Mira comes from a large family – she is the seventh of nine children! Her five older siblings all dropped out of school to get married. Mira dropped out too, because her family couldn't afford the school fees. But she always wanted to continue her education.

Overcoming Barriers

Mira used to take part in school competitions, and she would do really well. As she got older, her school had mandatory computer lessons and an exam that had to be passed before she could move to the next grade.

For Mira's parents, a laptop was a luxury item they could not afford. And during the pandemic, Mira was needed at home to help her family with household chores.

To help Mira return to school, Plan International worked with her school and the local government to provide laptops and computers for all students to use.

Dreaming Big

Now that Mira can use the school computer, she is quickly catching up on her lessons and is thriving at school. She's rejoined her school dance group and is excited to forge a path forward for her younger siblings.

More than 83 other children in Mira's community also dropped out of school. Back to school campaigns are raising awareness among families on the importance of education for their children.

Financial support and extra lessons are helping girls and boys return to the classroom and open the door to a brighter future.

OUR PROJECTS IN SOE ARE HELPING CHILDREN THRIVE



GREEN SKILLS FOR THE FUTURE



Many young people in Indonesia leave the country to look for work elsewhere. Climate change is having a negative impact on the agricultural sector, forcing youth to leave their family farms in search of a living.

Green skills are critical both for adapting to climate change and providing a good income. 122 young women and 110 young men have now completed eco-friendly training, learning more about green farming techniques.

And another 157 youth can make organic fertilizer and pesticides, helping to improve their crops and reduce the harms of dangerous chemicals on the environment.

Young people also took part in entrepreneurship sessions, helping them to run their own business and invest in their farms. Through 35 youth farming groups, young farmers are now able to sell organic produce at local markets.

There were 43 cases of unintended pregnancy amongst teenaged girls in Soe last year. And more than 80 cases of violence against girls and women were reported.

Through football, 240 girls have gained confidence and are now more aware of their rights. They learned about their sexual and reproductive health and feel empowered to raise their voices against child marriage in their communities.

84 young people took part in training sessions to become peer educators. These youth have led events with more than 600 other children, sharing their knowledge on gender equality and sexual health.

Children and young people are now able to stand up for their rights and make informed decisions about their bodies.

- -More than 3,000 children in Soe don't have a birth certificate, which is crucial in order to demand their rights. We will work with local governments and families to ensure all children are counted and protected.
- -For many families, it takes more than 30 minutes to access safe water. We will support communities in building clean water infrastructure.
- -1 in 4 students drop out of school. We will continue to improve schools to bring children back to the classroom so they can dream big for their futures.
