Meet Mira

Like your sponsored child, Mira has been empowered by Plan International to change

her life. Mira comes from a large family – she is the seventh of nine children! Her five older siblings all dropped out of school to get married. Mira dropped out too, because her family couldn't afford the school fees. But she always wanted to continue her education.

Overcoming Barriers

Mira used to take part in school competitions, and she would do really well. As she got older, her school had mandatory computer lessons and an exam that had to be passed before she could move to the next grade.

For Mira's parents, a laptop was a luxury item they could not afford. And during the pandemic, Mira was needed at home to help her family with household chores.

To help Mira return to school, Plan International worked with her school and the local government to provide laptops and computers for all students to use.

Dreaming Big

Now that Mira can use the school computer, she is quickly catching up on her lessons and is thriving at school. She has rejoined her school dance group and is excited to forge a path forward for her younger siblings.

More than 80 other children in Mira's community also dropped out of school. Back to school campaigns are raising awareness among families on the importance of education for their children.

Financial support and extra lessons are helping girls and boys return to the classroom and open the door to a brighter future.

HEALTHY BEGINNINGS



For many families in Nagekeo, accessing clean water is a challenge. Some children travel long distances to fetch water, which takes time away from studying. Others have to use unsafe water, which leaves them at risk of deadly diseases.

We supported communities to build new water pipelines and wells at schools and near houses. More than 3,000 families now have clean water close by. Children and parents also improved their knowledge of good hygiene and sanitation practices.

And 83 community members in 23 villages have completed training on positive parenting techniques. These members have now shared their knowledge through workshops with 1,557 parents. Mothers and fathers now understand the importance of nutritious food for their growing children, helping to reduce cases of malnutrition.



TAKING CHARGE OF OUR BODIES



There were 65 cases of early marriage in Nagekeo last year. Teenage pregnancies are also common, and many schools do not teach sexual and reproductive health. Early marriages and pregnancies prevent young people from reaching their full potential.

Through workshops on planning for the future, 1,751 young people learned about their rights and their sexual health. Youth identified their dreams and gained the knowledge they need to make informed decisions about their lives.

And more than 4,600 students, teachers and parents took part in workshops on menstrual hygiene. Girls are now able to follow good hygiene while on their periods and are supported without stigma or shame by those around them.

- There were 89 reported cases of teenage pregnancy last year. We will continue to empower youth to make informed decisions about their lives, bodies and futures through sexual and reproductive health education.

- Violence against children remains common in Nagekeo. We will work to raise awareness of children's rights and strengthen child protection mechanisms.

- More than 200 children have dropped out of school. We will collaborate with education departments to establish non-formal schooling to help children start learning again.

- For one in six families, it takes more than 30 minutes to access safe water. We will support communities in building clean water infrastructure closer to home.
