Meet Laxmi

Like your sponsored child, Laxmi has been empowered by Plan International to change her life. Laxmi has an active life – both on the volleyball court and as an advocate for girls in her rural community and beyond. She is pursuing her Bachelor's degree in Physical Health and plans to bring the skills she gained from the Champions of Change programme to change the world of sport.

Taking Charge of Our Bodies

Myths and stigmas around menstruation continue in Laxmi's region. Girls and young women are often prohibited from taking part in public activities while menstruating, and girls lose out on valuable education.

Many youth choose to get married as teenagers, but face challenges as they enter adulthood – young couples often struggle to build healthy relationships and support themselves.

When Laxmi joined the Champions of Change programme, she and other young people gained crucial knowledge on their sexual and reproductive health and rights. This helps them take charge of their lives, bodies and futures.

Leaping into Leadership

Along with learning about her body, Laxmi developed her public speaking skills and built the confidence to take on leadership roles.

As the Vice President of her Youth Network, Laxmi spends her time organising community performances to raise awareness of the harms of child marriage.

Girls in Laxmi's community will be able to follow in her footsteps – continuing their education, standing up for their rights, and becoming future leaders.

WE CURRENTLY WORK WITH 5,296 CHILDREN IN SUNSARI

OUR PROJECTS IN SUNSARI ARE HELPING CHILDREN THRIVE

KEEPING CHILDREN SAFE



Children from marginalized and excluded groups are most at risk of being affected by violence. Girls also face an increased risk of sexual violence. Physical, emotional and sexual abuse, along with exploitation and neglect, have lasting effects on a child, preventing them from reaching their full potential.

To help keep children safe from violence, 169 girls and 123 boys taking part in Child Clubs learned about their rights and who to reach out to for support.

115 members of the child rights committee also strengthened their capacity to protect children's rights and respond to cases of abuse.

More than 2,300 adults in the community increased their knowledge about children's rights and the harms caused by traditional practices, such as child marriage.

LEAD AND DECIDE





Teenage pregnancy is still common in Nepal, with around 13% of girls aged 15 to 19 having given birth. Sexual and reproductive health education and services are limited in Sunsari. Many girls are ashamed which prevents them from getting the care they need.

To help improve access to health services for youth, we met with local municipalities and health providers. 20 healthcare providers took part in training on adolescent friendly sexual and reproductive health care and are now committed to provide these services to youth. In addition, 500 young women and 458 young men increased their knowledge on gender equality and sexual and reproductive health and rights. Girls were empowered to demand their rights and boys now have the confidence to support gender equality.

"During Champions of Change, I led an event where people of all ages shared their opinions on the issues that cause harm to young people. Today I am able to advocate against harmful norms. Thanks to Plan for helping girls like me lead and change."
