CASE STORY: SIDALIA STANDS UP FOR CLIMATE CHANGE

Meet Sidalia

Like your sponsored child, Sidalia has been empowered by Plan International to change her life. Eleven-year-old Sidalia was born in a remote part of Timor-Leste. News and information are difficult to access in her rural area.

Living With Climate Change Risks

The agriculture and natural resources in the region where Sidalia lives are highly vulnerable to climate change. Limited water, erosion, and forest fires result in land degradation and loss of harvest and livestock. For agricultural families like Sidalia's, this is devastating.

Yet Sidalia, a natural leader, saw ways to help. She attended extra-curricular activities, including Plan's Climate Change Adaptation (CCA) project. She participated in climate change risk presented assessment and school risk assessments and action plans at the municipal level. As a result, Sidalia's community planted trees to help reduce disaster risks in their area. Planting trees is an important tool for climate change mitigation. So far, 1,420 trees have been planted in areas identified as high-risk, empowering the community with shade, cleaner air and reforestation.

Leadership for the Community

Sidalia has shown exemplary leadership in her community, and at her school, where she was the leader of the school disaster climate management committee. She led CCA project activities in her school, identifying school priorities and advocating municipal authorities for approval for climate change projects.

Sidalia said she felt "delighted" as she thanked Plan for giving her the chance to present to the municipal authorities. Her leadership resulted in change, and empowered not only her community but girls across Timor-Leste to work toward a safer, healthier world.

OUR PROJECTS IN AILEU ARE HELPING CHILDREN THRIVE

TOOLS TO SUPPORT PARENTS



Positive parenting can have a powerful impact on the health of children and their families. In Aileu, where fewer than half of parents interact with their children in a way to support their development, it was important to provide effective, gender-equal parenting resources.

The Positive Parenting and Nutrition project enabled families to develop and maintain effective parenting skills. Dialogues focused on gender norms and men's roles as fathers and equal partners, including early childhood development.

More than 400 adults participated in group parenting sessions, learning about violence prevention, nutrition, child protection, and gender equality. Young men attended awareness-raising sessions designed to help fathers incorporate a nurturing parenting approach in their daily lives. In addition, parents learned how they can create opportunities for their daughters, with access to education and elimination of gender discrimination.









Timor-Leste is at a high risk of natural disasters caused by climate change. It was vital to increase community-wide knowledge of climate change dangers and mitigation, with special focus on schools. As a result, ten primary schools implemented a number of preparedness, mitigation, and adaptive interventions to reduce risks for children. Civil Society Organisations (CSOs) were trained on climate change impacts and learned to advocate for girls' rights in relation to climate change challenges. As a part of this programme, children were actively involved in risk mapping, raising awareness, planting trees, and early warning systems.

In addition, CSO leaders worked with youth living and attending schools in rural areas, helping to facilitate training with a focus on gender and inclusion.
