

ANNUAL UPDATE GUATEMALA CARCHÁ





Together with your sponsorship, children and families are making positive changes in Carchá. Learn more about the valuable ways we work with children and communities.

92% of residents in Carchá live in rural areas. Here, residents rely on artisan industries like pottery, carpentry, shoemaking and silverware, as well as farming and cattle, for income. Secondary education is largely inaccessible: these schools are few and far between. This year, more than 500 children received scholarships to continue their education. 432 young people participated in open discussions about menstruation, breaking a taboo that often keeps girls home from school. Through our Economic empowerment programme young women can make their own income.

Meet María

Like the child you sponsor, María is determined to build a bright future for herself.

Maria is a clever, ambitious student from rural Guatemala. The oldest of nine siblings, no obstacles have been strong enough to get in the way of María's determination.

Knowledge Is Power

In María's community, many young women either are married off at a young age or move to the United States in the hopes of better work. Making matters still more complicated, María's immediate community is home to only a primary school, and the closest secondary school is far away.

Still, María has always been determined to stay in school and support her family. As a Sponsored Child of Plan International, María enrolled in Plan's "Connections for Success" programme, where she learned about empowerment, entrepreneurship and business management. At the end of the workshop, María won seed funding to start her own small business, a grocery store.

Nothing Can Stop Me

From the outside, María is a force to be reckoned with. A strong maths student and an aspiring maths teacher, modest María attributes her success to Plan's Leadership School, where she learned about her rights and the importance of determination. Today, María is a vocal advocate of girl's rights and the importance of education. "My advice to girls and adolescents is: keep studying and learn about your rights and self-esteem," María tells us.

OUR PROJECTS IN CARCHÁ ARE HELPING CHILDREN THRIVE



This year, our projects in Carchá focused on making education accessible, from flexible learning environments to adolescent health workshops.





Less than 24% of young people in Carchá are enrolled in high school.

Our two-year-long Flexible Education programme sets out to make learning more accessible to young people whose studies have been interrupted. Since January 2022, 778 young people have enrolled in the Flexible Education project. In addition to receiving traditional lessons in secondary and high school subjects, students discussed important issues like gender equality and the value of education. 15 offices have been established as a support network for young people to continue their studies. 207 students received additional vocational training in business development, providing opportunities for young people to generate income. 452 parents learned about the importance of education, especially for girls.





SAFER TOGETHER




Every child and young person has the right to live a life free from any form of violence.

We work with children, caregivers and local communities to promote positive parenting and establish protection networks in the communities. Since June 2022, we have worked to create Protection Committees, which aim to create a violence-free Carchá. This year, 160 young people and 253 caregivers participated, and the committees are now legally recognised and in collaboration with local government. 107 community leaders – primarily women – received specialised training in protection against sexual and gender-based violence. Today, these women are responsible for the detection, reporting and prevention of violence in their neighbourhoods.
