Meet Nezel Kate

Like the child you sponsor, Nezel Kate is making steps towards achieving her goals and building a stronger future for herself. As many young people, Nezel was unaware of the protection issues facing youth in the Philippines—until she became involved in Plan's activities. Now, she contributes to policy influencing that creates real change.

The Courage to Speak Up

According to national statistics, 80% of Filipino children surveyed have experienced violence, abuse, or exploitation. Through Plan's Protection From Violence project, young leaders like Nezel Kate are empowered to work toward a safer community.

Even though Nezel Kate is nervous speaking before crowds, she valued the opportunities to share her thoughts and contribute. As a representative during the Regional Children's Congress, she provided insights on violence prevention. Her experience prompted her to lobby for child protection measures in her municipal legislative council, who was impressed by her courage to speak and agreed to implement projects to support young people.

Defending the Rights of Others

As she became more involved in Plan projects, Nezel Kate found a safe space to express herself. Her confidence is growing as she continues to advocate for the protection of children in the community. She believes that the training sessions she attended encouraged her to push herself to be more confident. To her, the nervousness she feels at public speaking is nothing compared to the impact she's making as she advocates for the protection of children in her community.

In her courage and advocacy, Nezel Kate is helping to create lasting change in her community.

OUR PROJECTS IN NORTHERN SAMAR HELP CHILDREN THRIVE



Girls gained self-confidence as they increased their participation and influence on both a local and national level.





The International Day of the Girl highlights girls' voices and empowers them to advocate for a more equitable future. This year, Plan Philippines conducted a province-wide celebration where 60 children attended from different youth organisations in Northern Samar. The advocates participated in a day-long workshop to learn about issues in their region. They consolidated the issues and prepared recommendations for a call to action. The celebration was spearheaded by 15 girls advocating for the Girls Get Equal campaign.

The girls confidently presented their concepts to municipal decision-makers. These young leaders were also able to present issues such as early marriage and online sexual exploitation of children. As a result, local government committed to supporting the International Day of the Girl activities in the region's gender and development plan.

In collaboration with the Municipal Disaster Risk office, Plan conducted an assessment of the area. As a result, 1,647 families were supported with aid to purchase food, hygiene supplies, and medicine.

and roads were damaged, and agriculture was badly



Because children and women are more at risk of abuse in emergency situations, community members learnt safeguarding practices, and disaster risk reduction. Hotline numbers helped communities facilitate response.

- Increasing literacy will continue to be a focus next year.
 We will assist in establishing and equipping a community learning hub, and support teachers and learning volunteers with additional training.
- We will help address high unemployment by supporting career guidance activities for secondary school students and out-of-school youth and by providing training on financial literacy as well as entrepreneurship.
- · High rates of early pregnancy are a concern. Integrating information on the effects of early pregnancy in menstrual health management will be a focus.
