In the urban slums of Dhaka, the needs of girls and boys are often overlooked. But over the last year, more than 2,000 young people gained new skills to help them make informed decisions about their bodies and to take charge of their lives.

Parents and community members are also coming together to keep children safe and to give girls and boys the best possible start in life through early learning centres.

Learning With Others

But when Shahida joined Plan International's sponsorship programme, her world grew bigger. With her grandmother, Shahida took part in sessions on the importance of education. She started to attend the early childhood centre, learning and playing with young children in her community.

OUR PROJECTS IN DHAKA ARE HELPING CHILDREN THRIVE

For families in Dhaka, accessing quality early childhood care can be a challenge. Many early childhood teachers take off for other opportunities, leaving big gaps for the children and parents left behind.

At 80 early learning centres, 314 youth volunteers completed training on how to facilitate gender-friendly learning and play for young children. Training sessions also reached current facilitators, ensuring that 2,400 children can attend these safe and inspiring centres.

160 parenting groups were created, helping to bring new mothers together to support each other as they raise their children. And through father groups, 1,378 fathers gained skills in nurturing care, positive parenting, and gender equality.





ACTIVE PARTICIPATION



In Dhaka, girls and boys lack opportunities to learn about their rights and take on active roles in their communities. And negative gender norms often see girls at risk of gender-based violence.

To help empower youth to take charge of their futures, hundreds of young people joined youth groups. 140 young women and 38 young men completed training sessions on how to access loans, start a business, or get a good job.

And 2,148 children took part in life skills training, where they learned about gender equality, reproductive health, and their right to live a life free from violence. With these skills, children have the confidence to stand up for their rights, advocate for their peers, and achieve their dreams.

The best is yet to come – and together we will continue to work for a brighter future for the children in Dhaka.

Access to quality education remains a challenge in Dhaka. We will establish alternative education support centres and provide learning materials so children can open the door to a brighter future.

Around 30% of girls are married before the age of 15. We will raise awareness on the harms of early marriage, and provide sexual and reproductive health training to both girls and boys so they can take charge of their bodies.

Many families in the slums of Dhaka continue to live in poverty. We will support young people to gain entrepreneurship skills and create linkages with microfinance groups so they can invest in their dreams.
