Kurigram is vulnerable to frequent floods, and a storm last year caused widespread damage to lives and livelihoods. To help those impacted, more than 1,200 women received cash support so they could feed their children and repair their houses.

Young people learned about their rights, gender equality and the harms of early marriage. They are standing up against this practice and taking charge of their futures.

Learning With Others

Shahida's parents had to move to Dhaka to find work, taking her younger sister with them. While Shahida loves her grandparents, she misses the rest of her family. Her grandparents try their best, but Shahida is often left by herself while they are out working and she feels lonely.

But when Shahida joined Plan International's sponsorship programme, her world grew bigger. With her grandmother, Shahida took part in sessions on the importance of education. She started to attend the early childhood centre, learning and playing with young children in her community.

Shahida loves taking part in the fun activities at the early childhood centre. And she's taking this passion for learning into the rest of her life. With the support of Plan's community volunteer, Shahida has new educational materials and a drive to continue her studies.

OUR PROJECTS IN KURIGRAM ARE HELPING CHILDREN THRIVE

Early marriage rates continue to be high in Kurigram. Cultural norms, household poverty, and limited access to education are key factors which sees many girls forced into an early marriage.

Through Champions of Change training sessions, 670 girls and 442 boys learned about gender equality, children's rights, and the harms caused by early marriage. And members of 31 youth clubs organised awareness campaigns in their communities to prevent early and forced marriages.

600 young women completed technical and entrepreneurship training related to the agriculture sector. With these new skills, they can grow or manufacture goods and earn a good income.





THRIVING THROUGH DISASTER



In June last year, a devastating flash flood in Kurigram caused widespread destruction and disruption in the lives of families. In the aftermath of disaster, children and women are at a higher risk of violence. And they are often excluded or overlooked in the provision of emergency assistance.

To help people meet their basic needs and recover after the flood, Plan International distributed unconditional cash support, food kits and water to vulnerable families. Families with children, headed by women, living with disabilities, or facing extreme poverty, were specifically selected for this cash support.

Not many girls are involved in youth clubs, leaving them without opportunities to gain confidence and take on leadership roles. We will continue to create new groups and encourage both girls and their parents to take part.

Around half of youth are married before the age of 18. We will continue to raise awareness on the harms of early marriage and empower young people to advocate for change in their communities.
